

## **HONG KONG SIGHTSEEING TOURS 2004**

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### **FAE-01: HONG KONG ISLAND TOUR (approx. 5 hrs) (a.m. / p.m.)**

Departs at 0830hrs; returns at 1315hrs. (or departs at 1400hrs and returns at 1830hrs)

Tour includes a visit to Man Mo Temple at Hollywood Road. Then will take to Victoria peak (1,503 ft) by getting on a peak tram ride where treat your eyes to the spectacular view of the city and the harbour. An optional sampan ride (approx. HK\$50) will get a close-up look at the unusual way of fisher folk life in Aberdeen Fishing Village. Moving on is a jewel factory where you can have a glimpse of the fine arts of hand-made jewellery. En route you will able to view the Repulse Bay and the Stanley market where become a favorite place for local and foreign shoppers, you will find abundant stalls selling wide range of clothing and footwear, as well as for the bars and restaurant which surround this must-do shopping experience.

Departs at 1730hrs; returns at 2230hrs.

## **FAE-05: ABERDEEN & HARBOUR NIGHT CRUISE (approx. 5 hrs)**

Departs at 1735hrs; returns at 2245hrs.

Escorted to the pontoon, you will be aboard an authentic yet modernized Chinese junk – a way to put your feet up. Even if you don't, you are promised a relaxing evening cruise on the Victoria Harbour and see the sunset gradually dimming on the horizon. After the cruise is a fabulous Chinese-style dinner waiting at the famous Jumbo Floating Restaurant in Aberdeen. Take some snap-shots after dinner to adorn your journey there. Before heading back to your hotel, the tour bus will stop at Midlevels where you will see the tranquil harbour beautifully mounted before you.

Harbour Cruise – Unlimited free drinks are served aboard a traditional style Chinese junk for a relaxing cruise of the Victoria Harbour.

Jumbo Floating Restaurant – A superb Chinese dinner will be served at the world-renowned floating restaurant in Aberdeen.

Harbour View – A coach trip up to Stubbs Road Lookout to gaze at the spectacular harbour view. It is a sight that inspires and awes every visitor to Hong Kong.

## **FAE-06: THE FAMED & FAMOUS TOUR (approx. 5.5 hrs)**

Departs at 1330hrs; returns at 1900hrs.

(Only available on every Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday)

Hong Kong is an eclectic mix of modern skyscrapers, colonial buildings and traditional temples.

Central District is the financial and commercial hub of the island and where commuters and visitors alike catch the Peak Tram to the Victoria Peak. Another unique way to experience the buzz of city life is by riding the 800m-long central-mid-levels escalator (the world's longest covered outdoor escalator), which transports tens of thousands of people each day and has created its own escalator culture of cafes and restaurants. One of the best ways to view the incredible density and scale of the city is from Victoria Peak. Reached by the Peak Tram, that rises 386m up the steep mountainside, the summit offers an exceptional view, whether by day or night.

Alternatively, take to the skies on a helicopter (6 min) ride for an awe-inspiring bird's eye view of the city.

## **FAE-07: LEI YUE MUN SEAFOOD DINNER SUNSET CRUISE (approx. 5 hrs)**

Departs at 1730hrs; returns at 2230hrs.

Start with a leisurely harbour cruise with the view of Hong Kong's glittering Victoria Harbour and skyline is simply breathtaking. Dinner at the old village of Lei Yue Mun where is an off the beaten track destination adored by seafood aficionados. ## **FAE-09: MORNING HARBOUR CRUISE (approx. 2 hrs)**

Departs at 1015hrs; return at 1215hrs

An exciting harbour cruise sails out to the Eastern harbour area of Hong Kong, along the waterfront of Central, Wanchai, Causeway Bay and North Point before viewing the Shau Kei Wan Typhoon Shelter-home of the fishing families & their deep sea fishing junks. And more scenic contrasts including Lei Yue Mun Village waterfront. Last, you will move on the Causeway Bay waterfront known as East Point in the olden days to witness the firing of the legendary Jardine Noon Day Gun which is a tradition dating back to the early days of Hong Kong.

High-rises showcasing Hong Kong's architectural phenomenon, include Bank of China, Exchange Square, Hong Kong & Shanghai Banking Corporation, Lippo Tower and Central Plaza along the waterfront. And you will see the spectacular Tsing Ma Bridge linking the new Hong Kong Airport, and it is presently the longest suspension bridge capable of carrying both vehicles and trains in the World

## **FAE-11: THE LAND BETWEEN TOUR (approx. 6 hrs)**

Departs at 0815hrs; returns at 1530hrs.

The New Territories is an enormously diverse suburban area full of contrasts to the cosmopolitan city center. More than a century ago, this area was entirely rural. Today, the area still abounds in rural beauty. Yet modern times have made their mark. The Land Between stands both as a gentle reminder of Hong Kong\* past as well as a symbol of its hopes and plans for the future. Tour will visit Yuen Yuen Institute – It demonstrates the significance of Confucian, Taoist and Buddhist contributions to society; Tai Mo Shan – Hong Kong's tallest mountain for a panoramic view of Hong Kong Island and Tsuen Wan industrial town to the south; Luk Keng – Boundary with China. Nearby are a Hakka village and a bird sanctuary where Chinese pond herons and night herons nest; Sam Mun Tsai Fishing Village – Passing the Plover Cove Country Park and on to see how local fisherfolk breed fish in submerged cages.

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## **F AE-12: THE HERITAGE TOUR (approx. 5 hours)**

Departs at 0830hrs; returns at 1330hrs.

(Only available on every Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday)

Hidden away among high-rise apartment towers and busy highways, the past lives on in the New Territories... living museum shaped by the rise and development of the so-called five great clans of Hong Kong (the Tang, Hau, Pang, Liu and Man). Taking in historic sites around the New Territories, the Heritage Tour brings to life the customs and cultures of these clans and provides a fascinating glimpse of Hong Kong's rich heritage. Tour will visit Man Mo Temple - A dedicated temple to the gods Man (Literature) and Mo (Martial Arts). It was built a century ago to serve as a center of worship for the community. Also situated here is the Tai Po Market where sells all kinds of fresh products, dried herbs and seafood. En route to Lam Tsuen Wishing Tree to pray for protection and good luck; Tang Chung Ling Ancestral Hall built in the early 16th Century, the exquisitely decorated three-hall building is still used for annual rituals and festival celebrations. The structure was declared as an historic monument in 1997; Lo Wai Walled Village, the first walled village built by the Tang clan. Today it remains the cradle of clan activities and houses the family's descendants. The site was also gazetted as a declared monument in 1997; Tai Fu Tai, an opulent stately home built in 1865 by a scholar of the gentry class, Man Chung-Luen. The ornate country mansion shows how high-ranking officials lived.

## **F AE-13: DOLPHIN WATCH (approx. 4 hrs)**

Departs at 0845hrs and return at 1245hrs

(Only available on every Wednesday, Friday and Saturday)

The world's pinkest dolphins – natural habitat in the waters off Lantau Island. Watching these pink dolphins swimming freely is an unforgettable experience. This Cruise will sail past the Hong Kong International Airport and Tsing Ma Bridge. GO-AGAIN-GUARANTEE, if no dolphins are seen, you are entitled to go again on any other scheduled trip subject to availability.

## **F AE-14: Horse Racing Tour (approx. 5 hours for day races or 6 hours for night races)**

Departs at 1030hrs; return at 1600hrs (or departs at 1700hrs and return at 2230hrs)

Races are held on most Wednesday evenings and Saturdays afternoon. Horseracing is not only the most popular form of sporting entertainment in Hong Kong but also a must itinerary for overseas visitors and the SAR's VIP. Tour will include an admission badge to enter the Visitors' Box within The Hong Kong Jockey Club's Members Enclosures: includes welcome drink, buffet-style meal, welcome pack with racing programme and a HK\$10 betting voucher.

Note: Participants must be overseas visitors and are aged 18 or above with smart casual dressing (Jeans, T-shirts, tracksuits, singlets, shorts, overalls, sport shoes and flip-flops should not be worn). Visitors not complying with the dress code will be refused admission to the boxes, no using flash when taking photographs of horses at the racecourses and mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the racecourses.

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## **FAE-15: MACAU ONE DAY TOUR (approx. 10 hours)**

Departs at 0730hrs; return from Macau at 1700hrs.

Start with a 60-minute Hover Ferry from Hong Kong to Macau. This tour is an exploration of an oldest European settlement in the Far East dating back in 1557. As a result of more than 400 years of exchange eastern and western cultures, it has numerous historical remains to discover. Upon arrival, highlights of the tour include The Ruins of St. Pauls & Museum of Macau; Temple Of A-Ma; Casino and Lotus Flower in Full Bloom, and a new Macau Landmark – Macau Tower. Lunch included at a local restaurant.

Each group will be dropped off to their respective tour at the end of the city tour.

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## **FAE-24: SHEKOU & GUANGZHOU, CHINA (Full day tour)**

Departs at 0645hrs; returns to Hong Kong at around 2000hrs.

Depart by coach for Shenzhen Border via highways of Kowloon and New Territories. City tours starts in Shekou to visit kindergarten (except Sundays and school holidays), Free market and Terracotta Warriors & Horses Exhibition Centre. Lunch at local restaurant followed by sightseeing in Guangzhou. Visits Dr Sun Yat Sen Memorial Hall, Temple of Six Banyan Trees and shopping if time allows before returning to Hong Kong via express train.

## **FAE-25: GUANGZHOU & FOSHAN, CHINA TOUR ( 2 Days tour)**

Departs at 0645hrs;

Guangzhou, formerly known as Canton, is also known as capital of Guangdong province. Known as the Southern gate of China and for being a focal point of foreign trade. Sightseeing attractions are memorable. For lunch you are introduced to the world-renowned Cantonese cooking. Then onto Foshan, located 20-km southwest of Guangzhou. This 1,300 years old town is known for its handicrafts, pottery making, silk weaving and paper cutting.

Itinerary follows:-

Day 1: Leave Hong Kong by coach to the border of China for custom and immigration check to enter Shenzhen city. Tours starts in Shenzhen with interesting points such as Exhibition Hall of Terracotta Warriors and Horses from Xian and an outlook of the whole city. Lunch at local restaurant. Depart Shenzhen to Guangzhou by air-conditioned coach/bus via newly constructed Shenzhen-Guangzhou Express Highway. Start with sightseeing in Guangzhou which includes a visit to the Guangzhou zoo, local market, Dr Sun Yat-Sen memorial Hall, and the six Banyan Temple. Overnight accommodation at Star hotel or similar class hotel. Dinner at local restaurant.

Day 2: Breakfast at the hotel. Continue sightseeing tour in Guangzhou - Five-Goats Statue. Moving onward to Foshan to visit Ancestral Temple, Ceramic Factory and Arts and Crafts Folk Institute. Lunch at local restaurant. Continue sightseeing in Foshan. Depart Foshan for Guangzhou for shopping. Return to Hong Kong at approximately 2000 hours via express train and transfer back to Fenwick Pier.
